Stories From The Earthquake Zone

Life continues in the earthquake zone. It's been over a year since the great earthquake in Turkey. Recovery has been very slow. Every time we go, we still see heavily damaged apartment buildings standing untouched. You see broken buildings, broken houses, broken businesses, broken roads and broken people.

Still people are trying to move on. Some businesses reopened but on a small scale. Their bazar(marketplace) continues. Last winter was rainy and so the bazar was muddy with many water-filled potholes. My shoes got so dirty and wet! But the vendors are very friendly and they love talking to us. They really appreciate us for



coming to their province even though it's a mess.

On our last visit we got connected to a church in the city. They were preparing a memorial service for people who had lost their loved ones and invited us to help minister to the survivors. We met a 17-year-old boy Mehmet, and some of his relatives. The boy had lost his entire family in the earthquake: his dad, mom, and 2 siblings. When the earthquake happened, the boy was buried with his family under their collapsed apartment building. He saw his brother slowly die while they were buried under the rubble. His aunties said that he doesn't want to talk. His pain is so unbearable. He wants to forget this tragedy, leave the country and start a new life somewhere else. I have tears in my eyes every time I pray for him. May God create beauty from ashes in Mehmet life and heal his pain. Please include him in your prayers.

One good thing though, our friend Jizel and her husband Ayhan started to read the Bible with us. We shared the good news and they really like what the Bible says. They said that the Bible is very clear, and they have peace every time they read it. After the many studies we did with them, they said that they are 60% on the way to following Jesus and they just need Jesus to show them a sign. And when that sign comes they will completely believe and not only surrender to Jesus but they will also share their faith to their families. Jizel was already sharing all the things she's been learning to her family in Lebanon. Please pray that Jesus will give them the sign soon.
