Ordination from EFCA by Pastor Paul Eng

Ordination signifies that the church has affirmed a minister's call from God to ministry and to carry out the duties of a pastor. It involves laying on of hands that is rooted in the Scriptures (2 Tim. 1:6; Num. 27:18). The benefit of ordination brings blessing and grace to the church. Ordination from a denomination provides protection to the church as a minister aligns his preaching, teaching and policy according to the Scriptures and denomination regulations. It in turn helps people to follow the teaching from the Scriptures.

To be qualified for EFCA ordination, a minister needs to receive a calling from God as evidenced through himself, the church and the denomination.

First, he himself should have a desire to serve God (1 Tim. 3:1) and satisfy the requirements as a pastor (1 Tim. 3:1-7). Second, the church needs to support and recommend him throughout the whole process of examination that generally takes two to four years. The minister needs to submit a 35-40 pages long ordination paper and pass the ordination council exam from local EFCA church pastors and leaders that takes three to four hours and passes the national council's final evaluation.

In laying on of hands, the minister kneels before God to signify that he is submissive to God and His will to do the work of God. The primary work is to do the great commission (Matt.

28:19-20) that exalts our Lord Jesus Christ and please God. The minister to be ordained receives blessings from God (2 Tim. 1:6).

I was ordained by ECO and JEC on May 15, 2016. As JEC has become an EFCA church, I am glad that I can receive an EFCA ordination. The process has enabled me to study and prepare for the examinations. By God's grace and the support from church leadership and my wife, I have passed the exams. The ordination is also an opportunity to re-kindle my gifts to serve God and His people. To this I am grateful to God, all JEC brothers and sisters in Christ, and EFCA.
