Between the videos and the Bible, we had thoroughly acquainted ourselves with all the holy sites (there might have been a few videos on shopping and eating as well). We had made plans for baptisms in the Jordan River and brought communion elements for a few different locations. It was going to be an epic trip. While this was the trip we had long planned, it was not the trip God had planned for us. We were 100 miles out of Haifa, Israel's port, when the Hamas-Israeli war had started. Our ship was stopped dead in the water as the ship's captain determined the next steps. Israel made the decision easy for them as they closed all their ports and airports. In the end, the Middle East was too volatile, and we ended with a completely different Itinerary.

We were quite disappointed, but then the cruise transformed into something completely different. There were both ship-sponsored and spontaneous prayer sessions all over the ship. Prayers for the safety of people trapped in the war and the Middle East. Prayers that a broken world would turn to Jesus. There was a large Dallas based African American church that took over the main area of the ship and had a full on Gospel worship service. We joined them to sing and then looked up to see people on all of the ship's overhanging balconies, also joining in worship. We had multiple communions in different areas of the ship with different people. We could see the Holy Spirit working throughout the ship and we came back from the cruise renewed and refreshed but in a completely different way than we expected. God showed us how He could turn anything to His glory. Our cruise to nowhere ended up being a cruise we would never forget.
