It's Never a Straight Line By Ron Jue, Elder

I love the name of our church Journey Evangelical Church. Why? Because it represents the journey we are all on with Jesus Christ. We begin the journey as seekers and then we make a decision to acknowledge Jesus as our Lord and Savior. From that point on it's a life long journey of discovery and being led by the Holy Spirit. There are hills and valleys, unexpected turns, delightful experiences, love, and sadness. Through it all we acknowledge that God is sovereign and in complete control of our lives.

The victory has already been won. We just have to seek and glorify Him. As we journey through life together sometimes you have to take a step back before moving forward. It's never a straight line. It occurs to me that the

life of the church often parallels the life of a believer, with the church needing to take a step back before it can move forward. God will have us take a step backward so we can refocus on Him before we start moving forward again. This applies both to the individual & the church as a whole.

JEC is in a transition period. At times of transition there is often tension. Tension shows that we are all invested in our relationship with Jesus Christ and that our hearts are searching for Him in a real and earnest way. We draw closer to God by experiencing God and we experience God by obeying Him. As God commands us to serve one another, we must discern ways on how to love and support each other and the church family as we journey through life

together. God made it possible for the Holy Spirit to live within us. The Holy Spirit allows us to walk and talk with God through prayer. It's amazing that a perfect God made Himself available to us, an imperfect people and an imperfect church. There are many examples of heroes of the Bible Job, Moses, David, Paul, and others who had to take a step back before moving forward and God did powerful things through them. We should use this step backward to refocus on Jesus before we start moving forward. God is sovereign and we should refocus on how we can glorify Him and implement His perfect plan for us and the world. I'm excited and looking forward to see how Jesus will use Journey Evangelical Church and where we are headed.
