JEC's 43rd Anniversary

Journey is 43 years old this month. What follows are paraphrased recollections from one of our founding family members: Pearl Choy.

Who had the idea to plant a church, and when did they have it? We met together as a small group in home bible studies for many years. I don't remember who first suggested it to us; maybe someone from our church, True Light Presbyterian.

What made you commit to planting a church? It was a lot of distance driving to True Light for all of us. God made things happen, so it was confirmation. When we were ready, we looked into lots of places to hold service. God provided a school where the principal was a Christian. We asked Wayland to be our pastor and he answered the call.

When did Pastor Wayland get involved? We always specifically had him in mind to be our pastor. He was on the mission field in Hong Kong when we called him.

How did you grow the church? We identified Asians in our neighborhoods and went door-to-door to talk to them. We would follow up with visitors through phone calls to show interest in them and have them interested in the church. We would pray all the time; lots and lots of constant prayer. We and Pastor Wayland would do a great deal of visitations. We prayed all the time—before services and visitations. Thinking about and praying about the church was a 24/7 all-consuming passion.

What were some initial challenges? It was a lot of physical labor to set up and tear down chairs, tables, bibles, hymnals, and sound system each week. We had to be neat and respectful of the rooms for the school teachers.

What was one of the greatest joys? We formed as an independent church in 1980, then joined the Presbyterian denomination in 1988.

What encouragement or lesson do you want today's generation to know? Get everybody involved in God's work. The elderly generation is no longer able to do the same things as before. Reach out to people and talk with them. Find out their physical needs and prayer needs. Show them that you know they are there and that you are concerned about them.
