SERVE Ministry

There are tables being set up outside and inside the MPR, people are quickly bagging produce, and the aromas of delicious food being made by a crew of kitchen workers. It's a typical Serve Ministry Saturday happening on our campus.

Since 2013, Serve Ministry has been providing food and health services to our community. It has grown to become an official food bank that serves approximately 125 families. On Fridays before Serve, volunteers pick up food from the Orange County Food Bank and also unload the delivered food from Second Harvest OC Food Bank. On Saturday, the food including-produce, pantry items, dairy and frozen foods are distributed to the community. A dozen eggs were offered until the price of eggs became the price of gold! In the MPR, a delicious meal is provided and a team of greeters or prayer warriors mingle, talk and share with many of our neighbors. Additionally, a blood pressure/diabetes monitor station is provided as well as a free clothing area.

Whether a volunteer is doing pantry work or part of the kitchen crew, there are many opportunities

to share with our neighbors. Smiles or small, quick conversations while our neighbors are in line can occur. Volunteers find out that one of our "regulars" is a baker and so fruit or chocolate chips are given with a question, "What can you make with these ingredients?" Volunteers have been known to give recipes or make up recipes to encourage our neighbors to try a new food item. Lastly, volunteers will give a little bit more food because God gave them the insight to do so.

Serve is JEC's community outreach. Please consider joining us on a Serve Friday or Saturday. If you are unable, we are now asking for a monthly pantry item to donate on the second Sunday of each month. There will be signed crates by the men's restroom for you to donate your item. Our bulletin will let you know what to donate for the month. Thanks, and hope you can join us to SERVE!
