Because when Small Groups are done right, the sweet fellowship, kinship, warmth, accountability, encouragement and prayer support become items you wonder how you ever previously lived without.

Here at Journey I have found that same wonderful camaraderie in my amazing Irvine HUG Group as we walk our upward pilgrimage together. I know many of you feel the same about yours. So to those not yet in a HUG Group, I want to ask you: If you're struggling, isolated, lonely or bewildered, who cares? Well let me tell you, there are bands of kindred spirits here who you can join or form up with and you'll see that question answered beautifully. Truly the fellowship, support and love of a good Spirit-led Small Group can be like a foretaste of heaven.

"And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near" Heb 10:24-25.
