## What we've learned so far in Ephesians, chs. 1–3

### In Christ:

We are loved	(no longer an outsider)	1:3–14
We have resurrection power	(open the eyes of your heart to see)	1:15–23
We are saved from sin	(we are God's workmanship)	2:1–10
We have peace	(no more animosity)	2:11–22
We have a mission	(paint a multi-colored portrait of Christ)	3:1–13
We can be filled with God's fullness		3:14–21

## Paul was briefly enraptured, then returns to prayer, vv. 14–15

## Paul's main prayer: be filled with all the fullness of God, vv. 16–19

- \_\_\_\_\_ being strengthened by His Spirit, v. 16
- Christ's Tabernacle/tenting \_\_\_\_\_, v. 17
- Rooted in love, together knowing Christ's surpassing \_\_\_\_\_, vv. 18–19

## God is more than able, and more than \_\_\_\_\_, vv. 20–21
