Let all **bitterness** and **wrath** and **anger** and **clamor** and **slander** be put away from you, along with all **malice**. 32 Be **kind** to one another, **tenderhearted**, **forgiving** one another, as God in Christ forgave you.—Ephesians 4:31–32

Catastrophic character traits to put off:



- 1. **bitterness**: resentful cynicism that results in an intense hostility.
- 2. **wrath**: the external explosion of internal bad feelings.
- 3. **anger**: a strong feeling of annoyance, displeasure, or antagonism.
- 4. **clamor**: a loud uproar or outcry, especially demanding something.
- 5. **slander**: any speech springing from anger and designed to injure.
- 6. **malice**: evil-mindedness or intense hatred. Acts of hostility, harm.



Sweet traits of our Savior to put on:

- 1. **kindness**: loving affection, sympathy, grace and goodness
- 2. **tenderheartedness**: sensitive to the needs of others, compassionate, merciful, loving justice and hating injustice and sin, caring, empathetic.
- 3. **forgiveness**: the act of pardoning a repentant offender fully, freely, without the other's merit, full of mercy, completely, continually, as Jesus does.
