(–) Keep the eyes of our hearts closed, ignoring our hope, inheritance, and power, vv. 17–19

Don't let your heart be closed to spiritual reality. This is why Paul prays, this is what he feared for us.

Pay attention to the eyes of your heart.

(–) Don't exercise the resurrection _____ that we already possess, vv. 20–23
